The WCM is also the public relations leader (communicates with county officials, schools, the media, etc), and arranges outreach activities such as weather briefings and Storm Spotters courses.

JRTDI a Mental Health Issue sweeping Amateur Radio

JRTDI is a mental issue that is sweeping male amateur radio operators across the country and is getting worse. It is not just confined to HAM operators, but it appears to be more prevalent in HAMs. It is estimated that 50% of HAMs world wide will come down with it at some time. While it is not confined to HAMs, men working in a complex world seem to show the symptoms more. Mental health organizations are sounding the alarm and are calling for something to be done. While it is not an outward health danger like CO-VID, it causes a high level of stress and men to be estranged from their families. Men who exhibit JRTDI will throw things and curse uncontrollably. Men who would never curse before start. They will show signs of total unbelief about their ability to do things, even very simple things. They will at times show a willingness to give up Ham Radio operating completely, even long time operators. The longer they have been in HAM radio the more likely they are to show signs of JRTDI.

You may receive fund raising efforts for JRTDI.org in the mail, or get SPAM phone calls to raise money to treat the mental health problem. Igore them, there is a self help program that I will explain later.

A recent study of the condition by some leading universities and private organizations have shown that not only does it affect the mental health of males but that it is incredibly expensive. Younger members in the HAM organization are less likely show the mental problem. Men will throw away perfectly good radios and other equipment when the condition hits. It also causes HAMs to not use HAM equipment to its fullest potential.

I am not talking about the condition because I read about it, I lived it. All of the things I mentioned I have experienced. I first realized I had the problem watching a YouTube video. What is the condition JRTDI?

You can have the condition when you turn on that radio for the first time or have used the same radio for many years. When you notice that knob on that radio can do five things you never knew it could do before, you have the condition. JRDI is Just Read The Damn Instructions. I junked a perfectly good computer and I have had serious problems with a KX3 and an IC-7300. No one button on a modern HAM radio has a single function. You have to read the instructions before you can really use the radio and maybe read them twice. Read them then try to see if it works. Don't depend on YouTube but use it to try and figure out how to use it. Using JRTDI, I learned that my IC-7300 will work JT8 without another sound card and the radio will tie directly to my computer and has a place for a SDcard of its own.

I have made a promise to myself to go back and first read the instructions of all of the radios that are working and then all of the ones that were retired to see if there is something that I missed. Unless you JRTDI you will frustrate yourself, cost you money, and rob you of a lot of fun you could be having. 73 Morrilton Monday Night 444.10 14.8 tone 7:00
